In our Collective Worship this week, we have been reflecting on LENT. Lent is the period of 40 days during which we remember the events leading up to the death of Jesus. The 40-day period is called Lent after the old English word meaning 'lengthen'. This is because of the time of year when it happens, as this is when the days start to get longer, as we approach Summer. It's a time of

reflection and of asking for forgiveness, and when we prepare to celebrate Jesus's resurrection at the feast of Easter. The children have been talking about all the thinks they can do through Lent; giving something up, giving to the less fortunate or helping others.


### **SCHOOL LEVY**
